

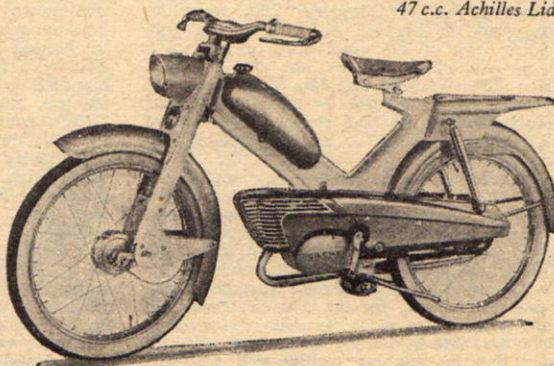

## Achilles Lido

THE smart Achilles Lido moped from Germany is to be marketed in Britain. The styling is modern: steel pressings are used extensively and the pivot-mounted 47 c.c. Sachs two-speed engine-gear unit is largely concealed by steel fairings which extend rearward to shield the transmission. Telescopic rear-suspension units are employed. On the main spine member of the fabricated frame sits a 1.1-gallon fuel tank which has a reserve supply. The rear end of the spine curves over the rear mudguard and terminates in a combined lockable tool box and carrier.

A frontal panel bridging the stanchions of the bottom-link front fork is of plastic material; it houses the electric horn and forms a cowling for the headlamp. Mudguarding is ample and the handlebar, constructed from edge-welded pressings, conceals the cables.

Colour scheme is two-tone green and the total price in Great Britain (including £15 4s 10d purchase tax) is £78 15s. The concessionaires are Currys, Ltd., 77, Uxbridge Road, Ealing, London, W.5.
