importance of keeping up the revs during this operation.

On most roads rear springing is a luxury. In doing without it the Popular sacrifices a little comfort but no utility.

As our illustrations show the side panels provide complete access to the engine. Each is secured by two wing nuts. This simplicity is excellent and rattle free. Another praiseworthy detail is the carrier, mounted well forward so the load will be within the wheel base, and fitted with a strong spring clip.

As many Popular owners will doubtless be used to two-strokes let them be reminded that this scooter requires petrol only in its tank. The oil goes into the crankcase separately. Oil capacity is 5/8th of a pint and the crank-case should be topped up occasionally Checks are recommended daily or every 100 miles. Clearly the amount of oil needed for this topping up is small but we have been to a garage and asked for under 1/4 pint of oil only and have not been laughed at. Indeed the attendant was much intrigued by such a miniature four-stroke.

It is this being different, when many 50s are much alike, together with the fact that it offers a scooter lay-out at an almost unrivalled price, that constitutes the Popular's main claim to fame.


