to the general public on February 19 with a whole page advertisement in the Daily Mirror, has a number of new features: A dove-grey and maroon colour scheme; larger fuel-tank of one-gallon capacity, including 1/3rd-pint reserve; silencing system with single large-bore outlet pipe; lower gear ratio for greater flexi-bility; and a streamlined fairing over front down-tubes, carrying on the line of the new fuel tank.

Retail price, including tax, is £54 1s. 6d. Gradual payment terms are £5 down, and 80 weekly payments of 18s. 4d. Existing special

insurance scheme will continue unchanged.

service.

The colourful new display material available to all Raleigh moped dealers comprises a new, enthusiastically termed consumer leaflet; a new price-card for fitting to the moped lamp; a reproduction of one of the Daily Mirror whole-page advertisements; and a bright new window bill. Summing up the position of the moped market, Mr. Bettesworth said:
