Another of the larger exhibits is that of Calcott Bros., in which the principal deviation from 1906 pattern is the fitting of a very neat quickly detachable rim brake. The device consists of a spring shoe, in which the sides of ends of the shoe are turned over to form guides fitting around the fork plates. The natural pressure of the

spring keeps these pressed closely up against the interior face of the fork side, against which they slide. The operating mechanism from the handle-bar is as usual. To detach it, it is only necessary to pinch inwards the brake-shoe, so that the guides will clear the fork, when the brake comes clear away from the wheel, and a very neat hinged joint placed in the plunger a few inches above the rim enables the brake to be swung upwards out of the way should it be necessary to dismount the wheel. There is nothing better in its particular line in the show than this as it is absolutely fool-proof, having nothing to get out of order. The other points worth noticing are the reduction of the £7 10s. machines to £7 7s., and the introduction of a special £6 6s. model, the range of price being now from £6 6s. to £13 13s. for adult machines. In their details, beyond the brake we have mentioned, there is little to be noted in the way of alteration. Roller brakes are still fitted to all models, but the special road racer at £8 8s. has been reduced to 24lb. in weight, or, with free wheel and one brake, 26lb. The £13 13s. Calcott has a metal oil-bath gear case in both ladies' and gentlemen's types.
