## SCAMP WILL EXTEND 50cc MARKET - Says Alec Clark at Exeter

Alec Clark, designer and director of A. N. Clark, the Binstead, Isle of Wight, maker of the new British Scamp moped, announced at Exeter on Monday, that his company would be selling Scamps through 500 retail outlets within a year.

At the first of a series of nine dealer meetings, Mr. Clark said at Exeter to 30 invited dealers that Clark marketing policy was directed at hav-

wited dealers that Clark marketng policy was directed at having one trader per district
with no overlap of territories.

Dealing with the main points
of the Scamp, Mr. Clark
said: "We are not trying to
knock the other 50's already
on the market—our aim is to
extend the market and encourage the public to buy a
cheap and reliable form of
transport.

"I consider," said Mr.

"I consider," said Mr.
Clark, "that the Scamp is still
too expensive at £48 when
compared with Continental
moped prices. If we are to
match Continental moped sales
in the UK our price must, and
later will, be reduced further."

Admitting that the Scamp.

Admitting that the Scamp was a compromise design, because no manufacturer really knew what the public wanted, Mr. Clark said that his aim in designing the machine had been to keep it as simple as possible and retain, where possible, the benefits of using a bicycle frame, i.e. narrow bottom-bracket and lightness with strength.

"In mounting the two-stroke

"In mounting the two-stroke 50cc engine at the side of the rear wheel we have accepted the fact that it is not yet possible to build a reliable engine nto a wheel. We have found no practical disadvantage to our layout, but two practical advantages—we have not been forced to miniaturize engine parts and our engine is far easier to get at in the event of trouble."

Announcing that seven representatives would be appointed within two months, Mr. Clark said that the first 1,000 Scamps would be produced by the end of March.
