YES, we live in a specialized age for bicycles as well as in other spheres of life. And specialization usually costs money.


I have been riding Coventry-Eagle's "Exemplar" model for a few weeks and it answers a great number of the modern cyclist's requirements.

What does he want in his bicycle today? Well, it must be "fashionable," a good looker, thoughtful in its detail of design, reliable and rideable. And then there's the question of price.

Including purchase tax and the Benelux 3-speed gear the "Exemplar" costs £22 19s. 6d. By today's thoroughbred prices this very well-thought-out machine is low priced indeed.

Fashionable Features

You can see some of its fashionable features in the photograph. The frame is Reynolds "531," the wheels are Dunlop H.P.s with wide flange alloy hubs, and the alloy bars are comfort shape as well as a racing bend. The brakes are G.B.s hooded and finger adjustable. It is certainly a good looker in its flamboyant red (other colours available), with cutaway lugs picked out in white and the lettering in gold. As for detail, the sketches show some of these, including track nuts, adjustment of gear control at the chain stay, taper claw seat stays, totally enclosed dust-free head assembly and lightweight hubs, the rear type

giving a strong wheel, avoiding dishing, by extending the plain hub on the side opposite to the three-cog freewheel unit. Such a welldesigned assembly of quality frame and good fittings assures reliable and long service.

As for its rideability, I have enjoyed three weekends away from home on it and enjoyed its romping response to my various moods. With its 73 degree head and 23-in. offset I was surprised at the easy steering. Almost at once I could ride hands-off (my test for safe steering).

I can find no fault with this machine (and I rode it in ways and places to test it thoroughly). The Coventry-Eagle Cycle and Motor Co. Ltd., is to be congratulated

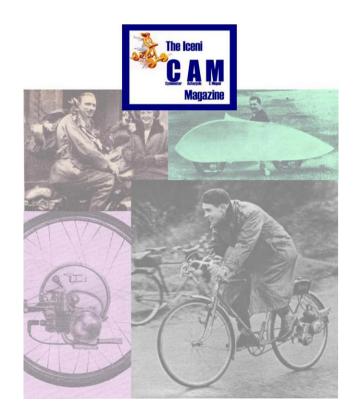
