


NEW COVENTRY-EAGLE LIGHTWEIGHTS

New from the Coventry Eagle Cycle and Motor Co. Ltd., of Tile Hill, Coventry, are three new men's lightweight sports models. These are the Flight De Luxe, model 30A,

the Autocrat 4, model 34A, and the Exemplar

5, number 58A.

At the same time the Ambler (numbers 50 and 51) now has the patented Coventry-Eagle prop-stand as a standard fitting, at an extra charge of 12s. 6d. more than that shown in

the current price list.

Of the new models, the Flight De Luxe differs from its predecessor (the Flight) in that it is fitted with 27in. white-sided covers and has a 2½in. handlebar extension. The appearance of the machine is enhanced by an attractive new colour scheme, while the normal Coventry-Eagle exclusive fittings—claw seat-stays and streamlined head fittings, for instance -are retained. Sheerline cable brakes and white plastic mudguards are included in the specifica-

With a Cyclo Benelux three speed gear, the price of this model is £19 19s. 6d., or an additional £2 if a double chainwheel is fitted.

The present women's model Flight, number 31, is retained unaltered at its original price of £17 19s. 6d.

The Autocrat 4, is as its name implies a four-speed model, incorporating a Cyclo Benelux four speed gear. Reynolds 531 tubing is employed for the frame, while the 27in. wheels have large-flange hubs and are fitted with white-walled tyres. Plated saddle-springs, GB alloy Sports brakes, with hooded levers, and a striking new colour scheme are features which should appeal to the keen clubman and clubwoman.

As a four-speed mount, the price is £21 19s. 6d., or as an eight-speed model (double chainwheel) £23 19s. 6d.
The Exemplar 5 De Luxe, number 58A, is a worthy successor to the Exemplar and is intended for the discriminating clubman. The frame (which is built of Reynolds 531 tubing) has upright angles 73 degrees head and 71
