**T**HE DUNLOP TOURING MAPS of the British Isles (on a scale of 12 miles to an inch) will be found the most efficient set for planning routes and obtaining a general view of the country to be traversed. Coloured contours indicate the rise and fall of roads, showing gradients and hills.

These contour lines and delicately graded shades of colour, commencing from the green tint of the lowlands, rising to the brown tint of the uplands and the darker brown of the hill country, with white mountain peaks, present in miniature a correct general view, in relief, of the whole country.

Roads are shown by clear red lines; the main roads are in double lines and the less important roads in single lines. Red figures alongside the roads indicate in miles the distances between places marked by black dots.

Maps on a scale of 12 miles to an inch are the best for *planning* a tour, but for closely exploring areas of special interest, there are extra maps on a larger scale for :—

LONDON AND ENVIRONS (2 miles to an inch).

THE ENGLISH LAKE DISTRICT (3 miles to an inch).

THE SHAKESPEARE COUNTRY (2 miles to an inch).

NORTH WALES—SNOWDON DISTRICT (about 5 miles to an inch).

Section I. is a Key Index Map showing the British Isles with the sections marked out in red rectangles and numbered to indicate the page on which each Section appears. There are 32 Sections in the Set.

The Maps are bound in waterproof cloth in upright book form with round corners.



**T**HE DUNLOP TOURING MAPS are in size 11" x 8½" and are bound in *book* form for very definite reasons. Anyone who has wrestled with ordinary folding sheet maps in a wind will realise how much more comfortable in use are the Dunlop Touring Maps.

They can be kept in the door pocket of the car, and even with the car travelling at speed can be referred to on one's knee in simple comfort.

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These Maps have been recently revised by experienced road users, and no expense has been spared to make them the most useful set of maps of the kind.

They were first published in the Dunlop Book (two guineas) and are now issued separately in a compact form, for use either at home or out of doors.

A critical reviewer in the "Illustrated Sporting and Dramatic News" declares the Dunlop Maps are worth two guineas a set.

They are retailed at 3/- net per set (cloth-bound and gold blocked).

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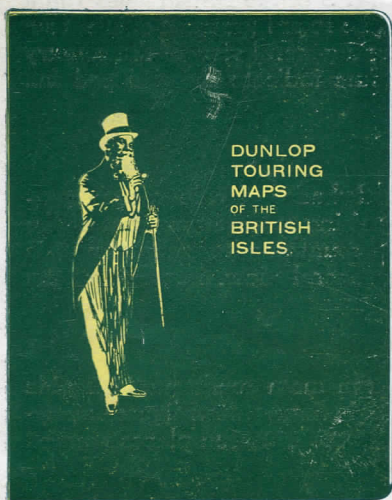
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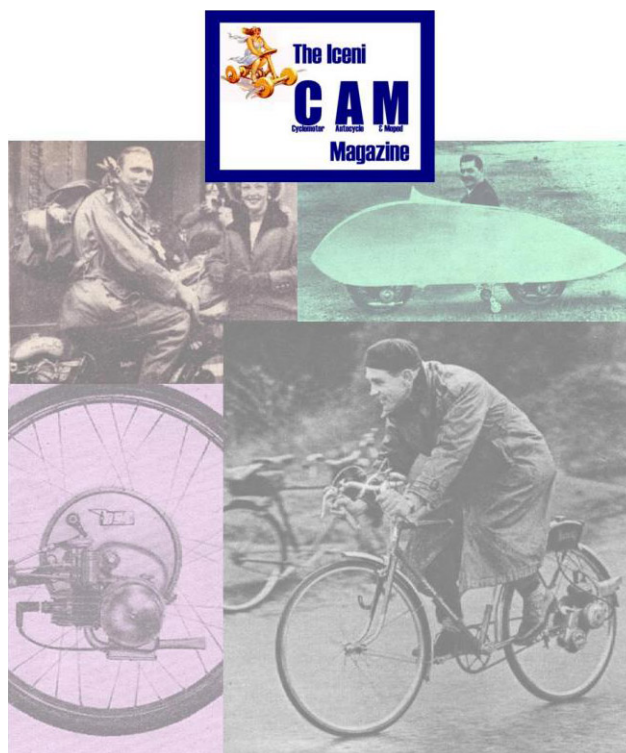
