A very important point in connection with the Griffin two-speed which has not, we believe, been previously noted, is that it is the only two-speed gear in which the whole of the gear is independent of the weight of the rider, that is to say, the whole of the rider's weight is carried direct upon the spindle, as in any ordinary single gear bicycle. Thus there is no strain upon the gear whatever, with the result that easier running is assured, with the additional fact that no strain beyond that of driving is placed upon the gear mechanism.
