Novelty at the Amsterdam Show

Machines from Eleven Nations: New Scooters and Cyclemotors: Emphasis on Cleaner Designs

Over 110 different cyclemotors from 53 manufacturers are on show. Besides the new models from well-known factories there is a variety of new designs, most of which are attractive little engines of complete machines. Noteworthy is the new H.M.W. manufactured by the Fuchs concern and designed by the Dutch agent, Jan Jonker. There are two models; one has a fully automatic clutch run-

ning in an oil bath and mounted on the nearside mainshaft. The second model has a slip-

clutch and two-speed gear box.

Other features to catch the eye on cyclemotors include: an ingeniously constructed bottom-link front suspension on the Ilopowered Gazelle; plunger-type rear springing for a Cyclemaster; and the two-speed gear box (including clutch) on the Magneet A50.
