

THE latest news from the Phillips concern is of an improved version of the Panda known as the Panda Plus (below). The main difference is the addition of telescopic front forks to replace the previous bicycle-type rigid forks. Another new feature is found on the mudguards for both have been deeply valanced. A large headlamp is now fitted and the colour scheme is Winchester Grey and Cherry Red, designed to appeal particularly to teenagers who form an increasingly large part of the modern moped market. It is effective but it has its disadvantages, the main one being weight and bulk. A suit I tested recently was strong enough to afford me full protection in the rain, light enough to make an inconspicuous bundle and also cheap. At 79s. 6d. the Saga Suit, made by Saga Garments Ltd., Whinbank Road, Aycliffe Trading Estate, near Darlington, is the ideal suit for the moped rider. Fully guaranteed it is manufactured from anti-tear, rayon based P.V.C. and is zip fronted with a large overlap.

Aquamarine





Pedal bearings, every 2,500 miles; steering head bearings, every 5,000 head bearings, every 5,000 miles; chain, every 600 miles; lubrication of handlebar levers. brake, gear and clutch cables. every 1,200 miles.
