THE three new Kreidler models briefly described in our last issue are being shewn for the first time in Britain at the Blackpool Show from Hans Motors.

They are notable for exceptionally powerful 50 c.c. engines with machine specifications that look like full sized luxury motorcycles. Of approximately "square" dimensions 40mm. x 39.5mm. and with 8½ to 1 compression ratios, the 3-speed model (which is available with either pedals or kick starter) has an output of 3.6 b.h.p. and a claimed maximum speed of 40 m.p.h. The 4-speed models are faster.

All models are fully sprung fore and aft, the "Super" having bottom link forks, and all have fully enclosed transmissions and dualseats with pillion footrests as standard. Big headlamps, 29-watt lighting and every kind of practical luxury characterise the specifications. The machines look expensive but the stuff is all there for the quality buyer.
