With these latest products of the Nottingham factory (the largest cycle works in the world), dealers can satisfy the urge of customers for something new, something better-looking and something easier to ride. All the models in the new range will be exhibited at the Earls Court Show between November 10 and 17. Dealers can place their orders for early delivery either now or at the Show. Introducing the newcomers last week to the trade and technical Press, Douglas Domleo, Raleigh A Group sales manager, said that the objective of the company in presenting the new range was to offer to dealers a range of models that could be stocked without excessive duplication of colours, frame sizes and gearing; on cation of colours, frame sizes and gearing; on the other hand, it was essential to give the public what it wanted. He believed that Raleigh had struck a happy medium with the latest range. The aim had been to make each model so appealing that it would sell on sight— "impulse-huying" of bicycles could be in future more general than it had been in the past,

Dealing with the particular models, Mr. Domleo said of the Triumph Redwing that there was not another machine in the entire Raleigh adult and sporting range that was less than £20 in price. It was a bicycle that could be used for school journeys as well as for pleasure and was certainly the best value for money that the group was offering today. The Redwing was made in diamond frame only, but could be used also by girls who wore jeans or shorts. The speedgear was fully in line with the modern demand, being a British-made Cyclo Benelux five-speed. With its translucent firecracker red mudguards, matching the frame finish, it was a model which would appeal instantly to young people. He hoped that deal-ers would stock and sell the Triumph Redwing to the largest of all present-day cycle markets— active, alert and discriminating modern school-

The Grand Turismo, said Mr. Domleo, was the Raleigh company's most striking attempt yet to satisfy the adult demand for something

different in lightweight tourist machines which were attractive to look at, easy to ride, more readily controlled and better in every way than so many of the older machines which were in use. Among its salient selling points were 27 in. HP rims with Dunlop amber-wall tyres, light-weight chainguard, GB alloy all-rounder bend and stem, GB Sprite caliper brakes, and white-rubber pedals. It could be had with either SA four-speed or Campagnolo five-speed instead of the standard SA three-speed. With the last-named, the retail price was £24 7s, 6d.

The sales objective of the re-designed Boule-vard Tourist was the teenage lightweight market and, again, here was a machine with market and, again, here was a machine with a fresh appeal. For instance, it was fitted with the SA twist-grip control, which would set new standards in positive gear-changing, without any need to alter the position of the hand or fingers when moving from gear to gear—a safety factor that dealers could stress when selling this ultra-modern bicycle.
