Six machines are produced by Saxon and wheel sizes range from 16 in to 24 in. The biggest models are the Saxon Prince (b) and Princess (g) and their specification embraces all-rounder handlebars, front and rear caliper brakes, sports front forks with solid ends, and flamboyant dual-tone colour finish. All Saxon and Richmond frames are made from best quality steel tubing.
