LEGAL NEWS.

A Rudge-Whitworth Injunction.

In the Chancery Division of the High Court, on Friday, Mr. Justice Neville had before him the action Rudge-Whitworth Cycle Co., Ltd., v. Dyke upon a motion for an interlocutory injunction to restrain the defendant from selling cycles under a certain price in breach of a contract entered into by him. Mr. Martelli, who represented the plaintiffs, stated that he had been informed by counsel representing the defendant that he was willing to treat the motion as the trial of the action, submit to a perpetual injunction, and pay the costs. Mr. Justice Neville said that was very handsome of him. The plaintiffs could not get more, and he accordingly granted a perpetual injunction as agreed.
