


## NEW WILLIAMS' CHAINWHEELS

WO interesting new lines have now been put on the market by Edward Williams, of Birmingham, and were shown, for the first time, on the Williams's stand at the Show.

The first is a new standard allsteel Racer Set, maintaining the requisite strength and rigidity but decreased in weight. The cranks are made of high tensile steel and heat-treated. The wheel is bored 4-inch diameter and designed to give extra strength with minimum weight.


The wheel can be removed without dismantling the crank from the axle or pedal.

The set is, at the moment, being ed the produced with 44T and 46T chainwheels. Other sizes will be added ard of as called for. Total weight of a 46T chainwheel with two cranks is 1 lb. 9 oz.

The other addition to the Williams's range is a fully detachable Tandem Set (D138). This can be supplied in a large variety of combinations. The usual standards of strength, accuracy, and finish exclusive to "Williams" will be maintained.
